Rotarians came up trumps once again to support the FIND Christmas parcel delivery effort during the week before the Big Day.

Geoff Watson was our 'man on the ground'. It was a terrific example of members pulling together, stepping up and getting the job done quickly and with minimum fuss.

A last minute delay with the arrival of goods and presents for distribution resulted in rescheduling some collection windows, so a huge thank you for the patience of those who changed their pick up times accordingly.

A huge thank you also to Rotarians who assisted with packing larger hampers at the end of November and to Chris Banham for coordinating the effort.

Geoff Watson reports that he saw more than 21 Rotary cars throughout the week. The 21 includes Bob Parker who, with John Riches, did bulk deliveries to Felixstowe. Fourteen of the 21 had another Rotarian 'riding shotgun' and the other 7 went out with 'other-halves,' etc. Therefore around 35 Rotarians participated and some of the other seven helpers were Inner Wheel.

No-one took fewer than 3 parcels, most took 4, some took 5 and David Chittick took 6, then came back the following morning for 4 more!

Geoff had a family commitment on Christmas Eve but Toby Pound stepped up to help with a few last minute deliveries.

The average was probably about 5 deliveries per car so, allowing for the Chittick and Parker factors, somewhere between 105 and 120 deliveries were made in total.

It would always be better to have more people involved but, overall, a good level of response from Rotarians which I know was appreciated by Maureen Reynell.
