



Orwell Challenge 2025 launch event

The Orwell Challenge launch on Tuesday 3rd December hosted by John Button and Steph Mackentyre was extremely well attended. We had 30 different charities represented and we were fully booked with both Rotarians and charity guests. The event, billed as both a launch and an opportunity for charities to network, was very successful with some excellent engagement in next year's Orwell Challenge registration opportunities. John Button also reminded them that there is a 20% early bird discount available for early sign ups before the end of February 2025.

We were joined by David Falk from Suffolk County Council who talked about the opening of the first stretch of the brand new King Charles III Coast Path. For us it means that our participants no longer have to take the foreshore at Nacton. From 2025 onwards they will have the choice of the foreshore or the newly created National coastal pathway.

Andy Lewis told our attendees about some of the other brilliant community projects we, as a club, volunteer for and explained how we might be able to assist their charities in the future.

The launch concluded with President George thanking them for their attendance and hoping to see many of their supporters taking part and raising much needed funds for them in June next year.









Young Carers Day Out By Dave Atkins

On 4th December, Ipswich East Rotary hosted a young carers event at Clip 'n Climb (who gave us a generous discount) in Ipswich. The evening was coordinated by Suffolk Family Carers, who provide advice and support to unpaid carers across our area, from their base in Claydon.

The participants were split into two groups of 35 by age and, after a full training briefing, had about 45 minutes of safe climbing up a variety of enormous

walls. The event proved really worthwhile with all the children appearing to thoroughly enjoy themselves, as witnessed by President George who dropped in.
