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

#### Generators for Ukraine - Delivered!

Through our collaboration with others, we have now delivered over 75 generator sets to the Ukraine; our club has contributed 4 and would like to participate on the next batch.

This has been achieved with help from Jeremy Fish (a Rotarian) at Ardent Plant, a large JCB dealer, who in turn put together a deal with JCB to get these

at cost and with cooperation with the JCB Polish dealers, also Rotarians, to deliver to Rotary in the Ukraine to deliver to the end users.

This has been a "Joined up project" and something we could not have done on our own, and has resulted in excellent value for every pound that our club has given to this project.

# Ukraine, District Foundation and the Future... Food for Thought

After much discussion with District Foundation in the hope of getting a matching grant to put together a project to provide generator sets to the Ukraine to supplement and, in most cases, replace electric power generated from their national grid that has been taken down systematically by the Russians, in the end we had to go it alone as no funding was available.

This interaction with District Foundation led us to do this project on our on and with the assistance of a \$1000 donation from our twinned Club of Ipswich Mass and ourselves, sufficient funds were made available to purchase 3 generator sets, which were purchased from a JCB dealer in Bedford who had been allocated 75 generator sets at cost — being a very generous initiative from JCB.

This still leaves the club with a decision to make regarding what shape our future relations with District should be. The system is designed so that each club should make a donation to District Foundation, which then goes to the US; after three years, 50% of that donation is returned to the District to be used in matched funding projects (after a deduction of 4% for admin costs). The issue is that it seems to be weighted towards the US with diminished returns for the District, hence the reason why they have very little money to use for match funding locally.

An alternative that many clubs seems to adopt is, rather than the club making a donation on behalf of its membership (which we as a club used to do) of



about £1,000, to donate as individuals in a similar manner as we donate on a voluntary basis each January to the Club Community Fund. This would also qualify for Gift Aid, which would build up into a substantial fund. If we adopted this system, it would mean that it would be the club's money to spend as it felt fit, rather than it going to District with a begging bowl to collect nothing. At the moment, the club's Foundation Committee are at a crossroads with no money available from District and most of the club money going to support local initiatives. This way would not sacrifice the 50% of what is sent to District and we would collect Gift Aid.


We are designated "Rotary International", and whilst local support is our main thrust, we should not forget what is happening around the world affecting the lives of many that do not have the means to overcome such difficulties, often caused by politics and power struggles outside their control, resulting in such devastation as witnessed in Ukraine, the Middle East and so on.
